Law Reviews: Finding the right publication for your research and submitting your articles

There are a variety of web resources for selecting law reviews or journals and submitting articles. The list below contains sites that allow users to find appropriate law-related publications for articles. Electronic submission sites typically have a list of law reviews that can be checked and then e-mailed together. Unlike the free submission sites, fee based services such as *ExpressO* can submit articles to law reviews that require paper submissions only. Using these services, an article can be submitted easily to individual journals or groups of journals. For example, articles can be submitted to the top ten journals, all criminal law journals, or any other category designated. Exclusive submission journals can be individually selected.

These sites are suggested for law review selection, ranking, evaluation, and submissions:

ExpressO.

ExpressO is a fee-based law review submission service. NSU has an institutional account. The advantage of ExpressO is that they will submit to the few law reviews & journals that accept only paper submissions, while free services won't.
