New electronic titles have also been purchased. The Thomson-Gale digital collection of the *U.S. Supreme Court Records and Briefs, 1832-1978*, is now available on our web site at [http://www.nsulaw.nova.edu/library\\_tech/library/resources/index.cfm](http://www.nsulaw.nova.edu/library_tech/library/resources/index.cfm). The *Index to Legal Periodicals Retrospective, 1918*, provides electronic access beginning with citations from 1918. The *Index to Foreign Legal Periodicals* offers electronic access to foreign legal periodical citations. We will also make the *Lexis Nexis State Capital* and *Statutes at Large* available in electronic format as well as the *CQ Judicial Staff Directory*. Two other electronic resources have been ordered, and they are *Oceana's Constitutions of Dependencies* and *Constitutions of the World*.

SmartPodiums have been installed in all classroom and lecture rooms. With the podium symposium, you can use technology in a number of ways to enhance your classroom experience. Apreso classroom software and cameras are also being installed. This software will allow for the recording of classes that can then be displayed in either RealPlayer (video/audio for laptops) or MP3 (audio for Ipods) formats.
