Welcome to the Law Center. I am writing to inform you of three opportunities to join a scholarly publication. Students who participate earn academic credit. Many law firms value this participation and take it into account in hiring decisions.

They are Nova Law Review; ILSA Journal of International & Comparative Law; and International Citator Project. Students may join these publications in their second year based on first year grades; those who do not “grade on” may also be selected following a “write on” competition. That competition is generally held shortly after second semester exams end.

The rules for qualifying based on first year grades (“grade-on membership”) appear in the table below.

Organization	Nova Law Review	ILSA Journal	Citator
Either semester GPA	3.30	3.10	3.00
Overall GPA	3.10	3.00	2.70

Qualification based on grades requires meeting BOTH the “either semester” AND the “overall” GPA minimums. Thus, invitations based on fall grades are subject to your meeting overall GPA after winter grades are posted.

Each publication is listed on our website’s student activities page, with links for additional information.

No publication will contact you without your consent. That is the purpose of this form. By completing this form, you authorize the administration to verify that you meet the GPA requirements set forth for being a grade on or a write on candidate.

Filing this form now is to your advantage. It ensures that you will be contacted by these organizations if you are eligible. It does not obligate you to join any of these organizations. No organization will receive any information about you other than your name. We do not release your N Number or your GPA.
